Itinerary

December 1, 2022 - Your Journey Begins!

Board your flight today bound for Virginia where you'll be met by your TRIPS guide and board your private motor coach to Williamsburg. You'll check in to the Embassy Suites Hotel to refresh and unwind. Then get into the nostalgic holiday mood as you enjoy your **Welcome** Dinner at one of Williamsburg's famous taverns, where the spirit of Colonial America at Christmas time is sure to fill your senses!

Overnight: Williamsburg - Embassy Suites

December 2, 2022 - Plantations and Celebration in Lights!

After your hotel breakfast, your day begins with a tour of Berkeley Plantation, located along the James River. This picturesque plantation was the setting of the first official Thanksgiving in 1619 and is where "Taps" was composed. Five terraced gardens, leading from the house to the James River, were dug by hand before the War of Independence. Inside the mansion, handsome woodwork and arches were installed by Benjamin Harrison VI in 1790 at the direction of Thomas Jefferson. Good Housekeeping magazine suggests: "If you only have time for one plantation, Berkeley should be at the top of your list." Guides in period costumes conduct tours of the original 1726 mansion and the museum collection includes Civil War artifacts as well as a unique collection of paintings by artist Sydney King. Following your included lunch at nearby Cul's Courthouse Grille, you'll tour Edgewood Plantation, once a part of Berkeley Plantation. Edgewood was the ancestral home of US Presidents William Henry and Benjamin Harrison, with an exquisite 7,000 square foot mansion that dates to 1849. Return to your hotel to relax awhile, then enjoy the Celebration in Lights, a two-mile drive through spectacular light displays in Newport News. See whales, angels and hundreds of characters decorated using hundreds of thousands of lights. It's magical! Cap off your evening deliciously with dinner at the **Whaling Company** in Williamsburg, a favorite old-school eatery featuring local seafood and steaks, and designed to resemble a New England boathouse.

Overnight: Williamsburg - Embassy Suites

December 3, 2022 - Get in the spirit at Christmas Town!

Enjoy breakfast, and embark on a walking tour of Colonial Williamsburg decorated for Christmas! From the first candle placed in windows in 1936 to the Grand Illumination celebration that takes place every year, the holiday spirit of Colonial Williamsburg continues to glow brightly! Miles of pine roping, truckloads of greenery and bushels of fresh fruit combine to give Colonial Williamsburg its much-imitated but never-duplicated charm and elegance. Your tour includes the Governor's Palace and the Capitol, and after lunch on your own in Colonial Williamsburg you'll have free time to soak in that wonderful Christmas spirit before returning to your hotel mid-afternoon. After relaxing a bit, you're off to Christmas Town: A Busch Gardens Celebration. Enjoy their all new attractions, dazzling shows and oneof-a-kind gift ideas for that special person! You'll be captivated by the million twinkling lights while enjoying hot chocolate and fresh fresh-baked cookies. Complete your Christmas Town experience with a visit to Santa's workshop and the park's 45-foot tall, light-animated Christmas tree! Enjoy dinner on your own this evening while exploring Busch Gardens.

Dinner will be served at **Lewis Ginter Botanical Gardens** while you admire the brilliant lights reflecting off a large Japanese-style lily pond, displaying lush seasonal foliage with creative lighting at their **Gardenfest of Lights!** Then you'll embark on a fun-filled **Tacky Light Tour** of Richmond! See holiday lighting traditions from by-gone days as well as today's brilliant and occasionally over-the-top Christmas season displays. December 6, 2022 - Parting is Such Sweet Sorrow!


After breakfast, check out then tour the Newport News **Mariner's Museum**. Its collection totals about 32,000 artifacts, equally divided between works of art and three-dimensional objects. The museum's scope is international and includes miniature ship models, scrimshaw, maritime paintings, decorative arts, carved figureheads, working steam engines and the world's only known existing Kratz-built steam calliope! Enjoy a farewell lunch at **The Chamberlin** which was built in 1927 and once invited the wealthy and well-heeled to soak in the stunning views and cool breezes of Chesapeake Bay, before heading to the airport for your flight home. **Enchanted memories of your Colonial Christmas in Williamsburg will last a lifetime!** (B/L)


